Finally, the transformation of our campus will commence this year. We have selected a highly capable partner to help us create a new and sustainable vision for the campus. We are already starting

to move forward with the modernization of our administrative building this spring. In addition, we have secured funding to install solar power at our school. This project will save Clayton more than \$1.2 million while significantly reducing our carbon emissions. It's an exciting time as we begin to dream and realize the full potential of this campus.

We want to thank everyone in our community for supporting Clayton. Together, we can absolutely provide hope and opportunity for children, families, and the community.
